## SPARKLING WINE - TRADITIONAL

*The fizz is created during a second fermentation, where sugar and yeast is added to an already fermented base wine to create the bubbles. In most cases, the second fermentation takes place in the final bottle, except for Prosecco, where the second fermentation takes place in a pressurised stainless steel tank, known as the Charmat method.*

Notes of pear and peach along with a seaside spritz give this Cava great complexity and freshness – party fizz!	
<b>Pago de Tharsys Cava Brut Rosado NV, Levant, Spain</b>	<b>£35</b>
A seriously sophisticated cava for the price. A super, dry and classy rosado made from (mostly) Garnacha	
<b>Corvers Kauter Secco Rose 2024, Rheinhau, Germany</b>	<b>£37</b>
95% Pinot Noir/5 Cabernet Sauvignon. A real fun fizz from one of our favourite Riesling producers – flavours of crunched raspberries and just a hint of sweetness – real fun stuff

Delightful sparkling Chenin Blanc from the Loire with lashing of apples and fizzing acidity – great value bubbles

Elegant and fresh with a delightful creamy texture, plenty of vibrant fruit and a long, complex finish

Champagne is from France, Carboniste is California! Oodles of fresh ripe raspberry, wild strawberry, and guava

90% Pinot Noir/10% Chardonnay aged for 20 months – pure, precise and fresh from this tiny grower/producer – all of the base wines are fermented in old Burgundy barrels, where Davy learnt his trade

Rich and decadent English fizz made with 100% Chardonnay – crisp apple freshness with a long and velvety finish

The use of oak barrels and time on lees gives this wine depth and complexity - fruit-driven, perfectly balanced

75% Pinot Noir/25% Chard from 40 year-old vines, aged for 48 months. One of the best Grower Champagne houses

## SPARKLING WINE – PÉT NAT

*Petillant Naturel (naturally sparkling) wines are made with a single fermentation. The wines are bottled part-way through the fermentation, allowing the process to finish in the bottle, capturing the CO2 which creates the bubbles. These wines are usually (but not always) left un-fined and unfiltered under crown caps.*

Col Fondo is the Italian equivalent of a Pét Nat – bone dry with flavours of apple, grapefruit and lemon – a bit cloudy!	
<b>Georgiev &amp; Milkov 'Funky' Mavrud Pét Nat 2023, Thracian Valley, Bulgaria</b>	<b>£35</b>
Very light pink colour, pronounced fruit aromas of raspberries, strawberries and fresh herbs - lightly sparkling, elegant, with great freshness, and a long finish – more delicious than funky!	
<b>Château le Roc 'Roc Ambulle' Negrette 2022, Vin de France</b>	<b>£35</b>
From one of the leading producers in the Cotes du Frontonnais of Southwest France – beautiful pale red bubbles	
<b>Zavec Brothers Pét Nat 2023, Styria, Slovenia</b>	<b>£36</b>
Cracking blend of Chardonnay, Welschriesling, Furmint & Sauvignon Blanc – cloudy to look at but super fruity and fresh – a great new Pét Nat for the list!	
<b>Tsarev Brod Pét Nat Riesling 2023, Danube Plain, Bulgaria</b>	<b>£37</b>
Bristling with energy, lemons and limes with screaming acidity – a Bulgarian 'Ninja' for those in the know!	
<b>La Cuvèrie 'Cerdon' Pét Nat Rosé 2023, Bugey, Savoie, France</b>	<b>£39</b>
This is probably the most fun wine we have tried all year! 80% Gamay/20% Poulsard – sizzling with energy and bright red fruits with just the right of sweetness to make it refreshing, not cloying – only 9% - perfect breakfast wine!

Zweigelt/Cabernet Sauvignon. Single fermentation fizz, bottled while still fermenting – super easy-drinking

Gentle fizz with flavours of wild strawberries – maybe this is what should be done with all Merlot!	
<b>Channing Daughters Bianco Pét Nat 2022, North Fork, New York State, USA</b>	<b>£42</b>
60% Chardonnay, 30% Pinot Grigio, 10% Sauvignon Blanc – fresh and a touch floral with apricot, peach and gentle spice	
<b>Testalonga 'I am the Ninja' Pét Nat 2024, Swartland, South Africa</b>	<b>£42</b>
The more (only slightly) grown up Ninja! 100% Chenin, bursting with red apples, sweet lemons, fun and frolics	
<b>Testalonga 'I wish I was a Ninja' Pét Nat 2024, Swartland, South Africa</b>	<b>£42</b>
King of all Pét Nats! Fizzy lime and lemonade for grown-ups... the Colombard grape may not be fashionable, but Testalonga have certainly made it smashable!

A blend of 70% Cabernet Franc, 15% Grolleau Noir and 15% Gamay from biodynamically farmed vineyards - like fizzy cherry sweets boiled down for your amusement and enjoyment – bright, fresh, with a sweet finish	
<b>Stolpman 'Combe' Trousseau Pet Nat 2016, Santa Barbara County, California, USA</b>	<b>£46</b>
The brilliant Raj Parr was instrumental in this wine's development... We love Raj and we love his wines! Incredibly complex with the tang of a young Pet Nat, but with a beautiful, aged grace	
<b>Las Pedreras 'Burbujas de Arquiton' Pét Nat 2022, Sierra de Gredos, Spain</b>	<b>£48</b>
Beautiful rosé Pét Nat made with 100% old vine Garnacha grapes – soft strawberry with gentle herbal note	
<b>Birichino Pétulant Naturel Malvasia Bianca 2023, Central Coast, USA</b>	<b>£52</b>
Aromatic, lightly sparkling wine with a touch of skin contact from California's Central Coas - high acidity, and notes of jasmine, peach, and lychee

Blend of old-vine Aragones and Castelao – bursting with red berry fruits and a touch of spice - great texture and super-long finish – such a great wine for the price!

Clean and delicate rosé from Lebanon made with 100% Cinsault - light, fresh and fruity – very Provençal

Grenache/Syrah/Cinsault. Perfect all-year-round rosé from Provence – dry, clean, crisp, delicious

A blend of 22 (yes, twenty two!) grape varieties that is so fresh and juicy you'll want some with your breakfast!

Watermelon and strawberry flavours mingle together in this super-fresh rosé from one of our favourite Oregon producers – we have been waiting 6 months for this to arrive!

Bandol is the Grand Cru for rosé in the region – dry, clean and fresh, with layers of strawberry, grapefruit and herbs	
<b>Pierre Morin Sancerre Rosé 2024, Loire Valley, France</b>	<b>£44</b>
Complex, versatile, and full of mineral charm. It shines with notes of wild red berries and hints of spice and pepper	
<b>Arnot Roberts Rosé 2023, California, USA</b>	<b>£45</b>
Touriga Nacional, Gamay, Tinta Cao, Grenache. Bright and zesty with flavours of strawberry and melon – the Arnot Roberts guys have nailed it again!

*Orange wine is made with white wine grapes using red winemaking techniques. The inclusion of the white grape skins in the process provides colour, texture and additional flavour.*

An intriguing blend of Falanghina and Trebbiano from the region to the north of more famous Puglia – another great intro to skin contact (orange) wine with plenty of complexity and texture... and colour!
- Eschenhof Holzer 'Invader' 2022, Wagram, Austria** £35  
Müller-Thurgau. Fermented with skins for 16 days – little colour, a delicate, floral number – great intro to Orange
- Testalonga Baby Bandito 'Stay Brave' Chenin Blanc 2024, Swartland, South Africa** £37  
Brand new vintage from the brilliantly talented Craig Hawkins – 10 days on the skins – vibrant, fresh, stunning value
- Georgiev & Milkov 'Wait What?' Dimyat 2023, Thracian Valley, Bulgaria** £37  
Intense wine with hints of yellow apple and quince, light florals, and cut grass – fuller-bodied with great structure
- Fertuna Vermentino 2023, Tuscany, Italy** £37  
Pear, grapefruit, flowers, and spice – a really easy-drinking, fruit-driven orange wine from the clever peeps at Fertuna
- Judith Beck Traminer 2024, Burgenland, Austria** £38  
Grapes are handpick and destemmed and then they macerate the Traminer grapes with the skins for 8-10 days. It is then pressed and after the fermentation finishes, is transported to old Barriques, where it rests for for 6-8 months.
- Pol Opuesto 'El Otro Lado' Torrontes 2021, Uco Valley, Argentina** £42  
An orange Torrontes! Apricot and quince stone fruits abound and plenty of aromatic florals - outstanding
- Ancre Hill Orange Wine 2022, Monmouthshire, Wales** £42  
Unusual blend of Albariño and Chardonnay - 100% whole bunch maceration for between 30 to 50 days - nectarine & tangerine herbal notes
- Intellego 'Sleeping Co-Pilot' Viognier 2022, Swartland, South Africa** £42  
Jurgen Gouws may have the best teeth in the wine world but he also makes some of the most interesting wines! Whole bunch fermented for 14 days on the skins in open tanks – bundles of apricot and zingy grapefruit
- Channing Daughters Pinot Grigio Ramato 2021, Long Island, New York State, USA** £45  
Ramato is Italian for copper and the colour says it all! Apricot, peach and a wonderfully bitter afternote
- Kelley Fox 'Nerthus' 2021, Willamette Valley, Oregon, USA** £45  
This blend of Pinot Gris and Muscat is bone dry with flavours of peach and apricots with gentle florals – amazing!
- Testalonga Chenin Blanc 'El Bandito Skin' 2024, Swartland, South Africa** £45  
One of the cult skin-contact wines – 2023 spent 14 days with the skins and is fresh and very appley
- COS Pithos Bianco 2022, Sicily, Italy** £48  
Grecanico (AKA Garganega). Fermented for 7 months in amphorae - delicate with great complexity and a pithy finish
- Joseph Swan 'Catie's Corner' Grenache 2019, Russian River Valley, California, USA** £52  
Copper coloured with flavours and textures of apple skin, hints of white flowers and orange peel
- Lo-Fi Albariño 2022, Santa Maria Valley, California, USA** £53  
A full-on Orange wine – fermented with the skins for 2 weeks – lots of rich tropical fruit and grapefruit pith upfront, with a very Albariño-like saltiness on the finish
- Domaine Bellevue Pinot Gris 'Maceration' 2021, Loire Valley, France** £62  
Somewhere between pink and orange - grapefruit, orange peel and red currant – stunning
- Radikon 'Jakot' 2018, Friuli, Italy (500ml)** £66  
Tocai Friulano from the godfathers of maceration! 4 months on skins in oak vats; the wine is then matured for 4 years in 25/35hl casks, bottles are then aged for 2 years before being released

<b>St Hilaire Viognier ‘Expression’ 2024, Languedoc</b>	<b>£35</b>
A classic Viognier resonating with peaches, apricots, greengage, and exotic spices on the finish	
<b>Valérie Courreges Vermentino ‘Le Vent dans les Voiles’ 2023, Var, Provence</b>	<b>£37</b>
Very pretty wine – fresh pear, lots of lemon and delightful floral finish	
<b>Jo Landron ‘Amphibolite’ Muscadet Sèvre et Maine 2023, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£38</b>
Clean, crisp, mineral, saline – grapefruit, lemon, subtle florals – Jo Landron is a Melon (and moustache!) master	
<b>Nicolas Reau ‘Attention!’ Chenin Blanc 2023, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£38</b>
Stunning Chenin - flavours of fresh pear, crisp apple and touches of honey & spice – wonderful, rip-roaring acidity

Stunning and electrifying Chenin Blanc – Granny Smith apple, elderflower, and jasmine – top notch stuff!

Beautifully balanced Sauvignon Blanc from one of the region’s premier producers (now under the ownership of Langlois Chateau) – citrus and green apple with a hints of grass and nettle	
<b>Domaine Pinon Vouvray Demi-Sec ‘Les Perruches’ 2020, Vouvray, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£43</b>
Quality medium-dry Chenin from a top producer – the appley sweetness is beautifully balance by calming acidity	
<b>Château Thivin ‘Clos de Rochebonne’ Beaujolais-Villages Blanc 2023, Beaujolais</b>	<b>£44</b>
This 16th-century walled vineyard is made up of the famous “golden stones” of this south Beaujolais region - the soil is clay/limestone from the Jurassic era, which is the preferred terroir for Chardonnay	
<b>Pierre Morin Sancerre 2023, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£45</b>
Perfect balance of fruit, acidity and minerality from 40 year-old vines – citrus, gooseberry and blackcurrant leaf	
<b>Justin Boxler Pinot Gris 2022, Alsace</b>	<b>£47</b>
Aromas of raisins, pineapple, golden apples and hint of florals note - rich and complex, lifted acidity, lingering finish	
<b>Justin Boxler Riesling 2022, Alsace</b>	<b>£47</b>
Super concentrated with hints of zesty citrus, pineapple, mango and a clean steely finish – top notch stuff	
<b>Justin Boxler Gewurztraminer ‘Kalkofen’ 2022, Alsace</b>	<b>£47</b>
Tropical fruit, apricot, orange zest, and a touch of ginger - the palate is just off-dry, lush and opulent, oily	
<b>Josmeyer Pinot Blanc ‘Mise du Printemps’ 2023, Alsace</b>	<b>£48</b>
Fine and delicate with peach, white flowers and apple blossom notes with a light touch - fresh, soft and very moreish	

<b>Domaine Aléofane Crozes Hermitage Blanc 2023, Northern Rhône</b>	<b>£48</b>
Textured and exotic blend of Marsanne and Roussanne with a delightful floral - expressive and packed with pear and citrus fruit	
<b>Alain Chavy Bourgogne Blanc 2022, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy</b>	<b>£49</b>
Some value from one of Puligny's finest – Alain has been making some of the best wines in the most famous Chardonnay village for some time now - super-precise with a peachy middle and hazelnut finish – so good!	
<b>Domaine Pinson Chablis 2022, Burgundy</b>	<b>£48</b>
One of our favourite producers and a wine that featured on our first ever by the glass list in 2015! This is what we like to call 'Chardonnay Unplugged' – pure and precise, like sucking lemons in the sea!	
<b>Jean-Luc Mouillard Chardonnay 2022, Côtes du Jura</b>	<b>£48</b>
Chardonnay from the tiny Jura region just hits different – complex and refreshing with flavours of citrus, pear, green apple, and blossom – you always get some angular funk in these wines, and they are all the more enjoyable for it!	
<b>Domaine de la Renardière Savagnin 'Les Terrasses' 2019, Jura</b>	<b>£50</b>
Savagnin, not Sauvignon! Aromatic and multi-dimensional - walnuts, dried fruit, green apples, flowers and hay	
<b>Domaine des Carlines 'La Vouivre' 2021, Jura</b>	<b>£50</b>
70% Chardonnay/30% Savagnin with intense flavours and aromas of ripe apple and pear with hints of spice - full bodied and rich with complex character - matured in used French oak for 15 months, has an older feel to it - superb	
<b>Thomas Morey Bourgogne Blanc 2021, Burgundy</b>	<b>£52</b>
This Bourgogne Chardonnay comes from five plots of vines in the commune of Chassagne-Montrachet. Crisp with wonderful citrus and ripe stone fruits, rounded with great minerality and genuine terroir definition	
<b>Domaine de Belle Vue Muscadet 'Granite' 2020, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£54</b>
A very serious wine from very old vines – intense yet fine, with a silky texture and saline minerality – textured, complex, balanced, brilliant – a wine that defies it's origins (and we love Muscadet!)	
<b>Patrick Javillier Bourgogne Blanc 'Cuvée des Forgets' 2022, Burgundy</b>	<b>£55</b>
Classic Bourgogne Blanc in the style of Meursault with apricots, lemon rind and hints of toast - made up from parcels within Meursault and its outskirts with vines averaging 30 years of age – very high quality from a favourite producer	
<b>Chanson Pernard Vergelesses 1er Cru 'les Caradeux' 2018, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy</b>	<b>£56</b>
High quality white Burg from the magnificent Domaine Chanson – soft peach and piercing citrus give this Chardonnay incredible balance – some time in oak rounds out the finish with a lovely spiciness – we love Burgundy!	
<b>Domaine de la Souch Jurançon Sec 2020, Jurançon</b>	<b>£58</b>
An explosive, energetic wine bursting with flavours of bright apple and lime – super-bright acidity and great texture	
<b>Domaine Pinson Chablis 1er Cru 'Mont de Milieu' 2022, Burgundy</b>	<b>£70</b>
Wonderfully concentrated Chablis from this great vineyard – lemon, lime and slate-like minerality – brilliant	
<b>Domaine Armand Heitz Meursault 2020, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy</b>	<b>£98</b>

A blend of old vine Zinfandel, Carignan and Petite Sirah delivers lush, juicy plum and other dark berry fruits with hints of smoke, pepper and earth – there is a lovely zing to the wine on the finish – excellent stuff

 Bright and seductive, this pinot offers fresh cherries, crushed wild berries, violets, wet rocks and subtle spices on the nose. Racy and mouthwatering, with spicy and mineral tension, it has a medium body, a dusty texture to its tannins and a lingering and racy finish. Focused and very precise.
- Ridge ‘East Bench’ Zinfandel 2018, Dry Creek Valley, California** **£66**

This Pinotage gained many accolades and for good reason - a fresh approach to this South African grape with a focus on elegance - floral, juicy raspberry, cherry and blackberry with hints of savouriness, spice and a waft of mocha
- Glaetzer ‘Wallace’ 2021, Barossa Valley, South Australia** £42  
84% Shiraz/16% Grenache. Lots of black fruit, primarily blackcurrant, with a touch of purple plum, spicy pepper, and just a touch of aniseed – rich and powerful, not one for the feint-hearted!
- Magna Montis ‘San Pablo’ Cabernet Franc 2022, Mendoza, Argentina** £42  
A Cab Franc created with finesse - it comes from San Pablo, the coldest and most extreme region of the Uco Valley at 5,250 feet above sea level. Pure bramble fruit with hints of tobacco and spice, velvety tannins and fresh acidity
- Cara Sur Criolla Chica ‘Paraje’ 2022, Mendoza, Argentina** £42  
Criolla Chica is known on as Pais in Chile, Mission in USA – the wine is very light in colour but these 90 year-old vines provide a punch of flavour – cranberry, raspberry, tea and rose petals – beautifully smooth and so satisfying
- Klein Constantia ‘Estate Red’ 2020, Constantia Valley, South Africa** £44  
69% Cabernet Sauvignon/28% Malbec/3% Petit Verdot. Ripe, dense and powerful with rich dark fruit and warming spice from the oak ageing – refined and plush with light, tight tannins – a wine for this cooler weather, for sure
- Murdoch Hill Pinot Noir 2023, Adelaide Hills, South Australia** £45  
Some Pinots from this region can be a bit over the top, but not here... classic wild strawberry, cherry, and gentle spice
- Ministry of Clouds Tempranillo-Grenache 2023, McLaren Vale, South Australia** £45  
This wine combines fragrant notes of pomegranate, sarsaparilla, violets and freshly-turned earth typical of McLaren Vale Tempranillo with the red-berried perfume and succulence of old vine Grenache

- Thistle & Weed ‘Nastergal’ 2022, Western Cape, South Africa** £46  
Portuguese-inspired blend of Tempranillo, Alicante-Bouschet, Touriga Nacional, Pontak, Sousão, and Touriga Franca! Blackberry, blueberries with spices - cinnamon and black pepper – there is an intensity to the wine, but it never gets too big, and has an understated elegance
- Ravensworth Barbera/Nebbiolo 2022, Murrumbatemen, NSW, Australia** £46  
A perfect partnership between two Piedmont greats – with bright fruit provided by the Barbera and structure by the Nebbiolo - cherry, strawberry, rose petals, blueberry and orange peel – a fab new addition!
- Ten Minutes By Tractor ‘10X’ Pinot Noir 2024, Mornington Peninsula, Australia** £47  
A fabulous Aussie Pinot from Mornington Peninsula, with delicious fruit and an amazing structure - the nose is wild, the taste has lashings of Morello cherry, rhubarb and spice
- Testalonga ‘Dark Side’ Syrah 2022, Swartland, South Africa** £48  
Best Syrah yet from Craig and Carla – all the flavour of SA Syrah wrapped in a zingy cloak of bright acidity – so good
- Ataraxia Pinot Noir 2022, Hemel-en-Aarde, South Africa** £48  
Silky and balanced Pinot, featuring flavours of red cherry, wild strawberry, and forest floor, with a smooth finish – you love their Chard, time to give the Pinot a go!
- Akitu ‘A2’ Pinot Noir 2020, Central Otago, New Zealand** £49  
Whole bunch pressed and aged in French oak (12% new) – a broad and muscular Pinot that retains elegance – lots of bright cherry and redcurrant fruit, with a touch of warm cinnamon spice
- Ministry of Clouds Shiraz 2023, McLaren Vale, South Australia** £50  
Polished Shiraz from the Ministry! Blackberry, damson and black raspberry with notes of fresh herbs, fennel and peppery meat – the wine retains a great freshness and has a super silky texture
- Murdoch Hill ‘Landau’ Syrah 2022, Adelaide Hills, South Australia** £52  
Michael Downer is very clear this is a Syrah, not a Shiraz! Far more in common with the wines of Crozes Hermitage than the Barossa, the wine is packed with bright fruit and complex notes of smoked bacon and olive
- Ahrens Family ‘Black’ 2021, Swartland, South Africa** £52  
We love Albert’s wines - a Syrah-led Rhône style blend with flavours of blackberries, black olives and raspberries
- Lowerland Tannat ‘Tolbos’ 2019, Prieska, South Africa** £52  
Dark forest fruits with good acidity and firm but rounded tannins – the finish has hints of dark spice and tobacco
- Castagna ‘Adam’s Rib The Red’ 2022, Beechworth, Victoria, Australia** £55  
Primarily Nebbiolo with some Syrah and a smattering of Sangiovese. A wonderful blend of fruitiness and savouriness - woody spice and blue-black berries with just enough tannin to frame everything – silky smooth
- Murdoch Hill ‘Apollo’ Pinot Noir 2022, Adelaide Hills, South Australia** £58  
Top notch Aussie Pinot from the brilliant Michael Downer – 20% whole bunches in the ferment provide a lovely silky texture to complement the bright red fruits baking spice, and earthy notes
- Glaetzer Wines ‘Anaperenna’ 2021, Barossa Valley, South Australia** £59  
79% Shiraz / 21% Cabernet Sauvignon. Exceptional old vine fruit was sourced from the famed Ebenezer sub district at the northern tip of the Barossa Valley. Big black and red fruit, with great structure from the Cab
- Ten Minutes By Tractor ‘Up the Hill’ Pinot Noir 2021, Mornington Peninsula, Australia** £59  
Layers of cherry, raspberry and spice – this  
Pinot has a sense of power, without ever becoming over-ripe... seriously good judgment of when to pick and how to manage these wonderful grapes
- Glaetzer Wines ‘Amon-Ra’ 2021, Barossa Valley, South Australia** £67  
A prestigious full-bodied red wine created from 100% Shiraz grapes - the wine is named after the ancient Egyptian God of Sun, Amon-Ra, who represents power, strength, and opulence
