SPARKLING WINE - TRADITIONAL

The fizz is created during a second fermentation, where sugar and yeast is added to an already fermented base wine to create the bubbles. In most cases, the second fermentation takes place in the final bottle, except for Prosecco, where the second fermentation takes place in a pressurised (usually) stainless steel tank, known as the Charmat method.

SPARKLING WINE – PÉT NAT

Petillant Naturel (naturally sparkling) wines are made with a single fermentation. The wines are bottled part-way through the fermentation, allowing the process to finish in the bottle, capturing the CO2 which creates the bubbles. These wines are usually (but not always) left un-fined and unfiltered under crown caps.

Also, sometimes referred to as Méthode Ancestral.

ORANGE WINE

Orange wine is made with white wine grapes using red winemaking techniques. The inclusion of the white grape skins in the process provides colour, texture and additional flavour.

Made in the ramato (Italian for copper) style – 30 days on skins, aged in a combination of new and old French oak

Grecanico (AKA Garganega). Fermented for 7 months in amphorae - delicate with great complexity and a pithy finish	
Oriol Artigas 'El Rumbera' 2019, Alella, Spain	£40
Xarel-lo (or Pansa Blanca as it is called in Alella) is more commonly associated with Cava – this still wine spends a short amount of time on the skins to produce a wonderfully textured wine with flavours of apple, nectarine and sea-spray	
Jauma '1000 Fires' 2020, McLaren Vale, South Australia	£42
Blend of Muscat & Chenin Blanc – fun and funky with tropical fruit profile and crisp, citrusy acidity

One of the cult skin-contact wines – 2021 only spent 14 days with the skins and is fresh and very appley

One of the oldest estates in Alsace – now the 14 th generation – textured wine with pears, peaches and gingerbread spice	
Domaine Bernard Defaix Saint Bris 2019, Burgundy	£34
An oddity from Burgundy... Saint Bris is the only appellation allowed to bottle Sauvignon Blanc! Imagine a cross of Chablis and Sancerre and you won't be far off – plenty of citrus with a touch of freshly cut grass

The domaine is named after the length of the Loire River (1006 Km) - from a single plot of 40-year-old vines, this Melon oozes class – good weight from 6 months on the lees – apples, citrus and a spritz of sea-spray

Electrifying wine from maverick Nicolas Reau – liquid apple Tarte Tatin!

Intense Chenin Blanc from one of the very best – apple, lime, flint, spice and electric energy – sit back and enjoy!

Clean aromas of apricot, peach and melon, with a creamy texture and a soft, rounded, slightly smoky finish	
Cossetti Gavi 'Gelsomora' 2020, Piedmont, Italy	£33
Sometimes referred to as the 'Chablis of Italy' – crisp, citrusy and super-fresh... classics are classics for a reason!	
Vale de Capucca Branco 2018, Lisbon, Portugal	£34
Blend of 85% Fernao Pires/15% Arinto. Baked apples and spice with a touch of asparagus and a mineral, saline finish	
Diwald Gruner Veltliner 'Gösing' 2019, Wagram, Austria	£35
Grown on loess soil in the highest altitudes of Wagram, vinified by brilliant Martin Diwald – citrus, peach, watercress	
Kamara Estate 'Stalisma' 2020, Thessaloniki, Greece	£35
90% Malagousia, 10% Xinomavro. Almost sour note of preserved lemon and ripe peach with some savoury spice	
Renegade 'Alexandra' Riesling 2020, made in London, grown in Germany	£37
A very non-German Riesling! A London twist has made her very green appely, limey, minerally and saline	
Laventura Viura Rioja Blanco 2020, Rioja, Spain	£38
Zippy white Rioja with aromas and flavours of tangy lemon, peach and geranium – from 80-year-old vines	
Laventura Malvasia 2020, Rioja, Spain	£40
Notes of apricot, quince, and lemon with a hint of honeysuckle – vibrant and slightly prickly texture	
Manni Nössing Grüner Veltliner 2020, Alto Adige, Italy	£42
Very pure and precise Grüner, grown in vineyards at 700m altitude – peach and green apple with a wonderfully prickly texture and watercress finish – 50% of the wine was aged in old acacia barrels to add texture, not flavour	
JJ Prüm Riesling Kabinett 'Graacher Himmelreich' 2020, Mosel, Germany	£52
From one of the greatest Riesling vineyards in the world – peaches, lemons, and pineapple – off-dry, beautifully balanced

Bright, aromatic and textured field blend from New York's original urban winery – a touch of tannin from the skins

Graham Tatomer spent 4 years as assistant winemaker as Emmerich Knoll in Austria – now he makes exceptional Riesling and Gruners in California - Round and fleshy with subtle acidity - orange, lemons, honeydew melon, minerals

Fantastic Chard from Sashi Moorman and Raj Parr – there is a reason this wine has been on the list for 6 years! Intense citrus and nectarine, with a touch of caramel on the finish	
Kelley Fox 'Willamette Blanc' 2020, Oregon	£45
70% Pinot Noir/30% Chardonnay. Rose gold in colour with notes of sour citrus, a hint of strawberry and a touch of brioche. This wine only came about as there wasn't enough Pinot Noir to make her usual reds due to the damage caused by forest fires	
Kelley Fox 'Freedom Hill' Pinot Blanc 2019, Willamette Valley, Oregon	£45
Lemon, satsuma, peach and apple - the texture, depth and power is breath-taking – Pinot Blanc is often labelled a 'boring' or 'workhorse' grape- this one is simply extraordinary	
Tatomer 'Meeresboden' Grüner Veltiner 2018, Santa Barbara County, California	£47
Meeresboden is German for 'Ocean Soil', denoting the vineyard's location amongst the sand dunes – rich, spicy, ace!	
Jolie Laide 'Rodnik Farm' Melon de Bourgogne 2020, Chalone, California	£49
Californian Muscadet from trailblazer Scott Schultz – only 1,000 bottles produced... we're so lucky to get any!	
Origin Pinot Gouges 'Minimus White' 2016, Oregon	£50
A white mutation of Pinot Noir smuggled into the USA from Nuits-Saint-Georges in a suitcase – serious and classy	
Broc Cellars 'Frei' Chenin Blanc 2017, Solano County, California	£50
Another incredible wine from Chris Brockway, perfectly walking the tightrope of generosity and purity	
Kunin 'Pape Star Blonde' 2019, Santa Ynez Valley, California	£52
Inspired by the white wines of Chateauneuf du Pape, this is a blend of Grenache Blanc (80%) and Roussanne (20%) A highly textural wine, full bodied but very pretty - creamy white peach, apple, lime peel and stony minerals	
Chanin 'Los Alamos' Chardonnay 2019, Santa Barbara County, California	£54
Ripe nectarine, citrus freshness, toasty, spicy, touch of caramel – this is what new-wave Cali Chardonnay is all about
