## SPARKLING WINE - TRADITIONAL

*The fizz is created during a second fermentation, where sugar and yeast is added to an already fermented base wine to create the bubbles. In most cases, the second fermentation takes place in the final bottle, except for Prosecco, where the second fermentation takes place in a pressurised (usually) stainless steel tank, known as the Charmat method.*

## SPARKLING WINE – PÉT NAT

*Petillant Naturel (naturally sparkling) wines are made with a single fermentation. The wines are bottled part-way through the fermentation, allowing the process to finish in the bottle, capturing the CO2 which creates the bubbles. These wines are usually (but not always) left un-fined and unfiltered under crown caps.*

*Also, sometimes referred to as Méthode Ancestral.*

Müller-Thurgau. Fermented with skins for 16 days – little colour, a delicate, floral number – great intro to Orange

Blend of Verdejo and Malvasia - the extended contact on skins gives the wine intense depth, quince and apricot skin, something just a touch savoury and then that ginger and spicy citrus push through on the long fresh finish	
<b>Intellego 'Story of Harry' 2020, Swartland, South Africa</b>	<b>£34</b>
90% Chenin/10% Chardonnay – the Chenin has 8 days of skin contact, none for the Chard – baked apples, creamy	
<b>Pol Opuesto 'El Otro Lado' Torrontes 2018, Uco Valley, Argentina</b>	<b>£34</b>
An orange Torrontes! Apricot and quince stone fruits abound and plenty of aromatic florals - outstanding	
<b>Matic 'Postopoma' Orange 2020, Stajerska, Slovenia</b>	<b>£35</b>
A field blend of Kerner and Riesling, which has been macerated on skins for several weeks to develop an exciting colour, texture, and flavour profile – baked apples and a refreshing citrus finish	
<b>Arianna Occhipinti 'SP68' Bianco 2021, Sicily, Italy</b>	<b>£37</b>
Incredible blend of Zibibbo and Albalanello with a few days on the skins – fresh and fragrant – an incredible wine	
<b>Qvevri Wine Cellar Rkatsiteli 'Qvevri' 2019, Kakheti, Georgia,</b>	<b>£38</b>
Made from the ancient Georgian vine variety Rkatsiteli. After fermentation, the wine is stored for 6-7 months in qvevri sealed with clay. Dried fruits, flowers and roasted walnuts, rasping tannins	
<b>Renegade 'Araceli' Pinot Grigio 2020, made in London, grown in Germany</b>	<b>£39</b>
Made in the ramato (Italian for copper) style – 30 days on skins, aged in a combination of new and old French oak

Grecanico (AKA Garganega). Fermented for 7 months in amphorae - delicate with great complexity and a pithy finish	
<b>Oriol Artigas 'El Rumbera' 2019, Alella, Spain</b>	<b>£40</b>
Xarel-lo (or Pansa Blanca as it is called in Alella) is more commonly associated with Cava – this still wine spends a short amount of time on the skins to produce a wonderfully textured wine with flavours of apple, nectarine and sea-spray	
<b>Testalonga Chenin Blanc 'El Bandito Skin' 2021, Swartland, South Africa</b>	<b>£45</b>
One of the cult skin-contact wines – 2021 only spent 14 days with the skins and is fresh and very appley	
<b>Joseph Swan 'Catie's Corner' Grenache 2017, Russian River Valley, California, USA</b>	<b>£48</b>
Copper coloured with flavours and textures of apple skin, hints of white flowers and orange peel	
<b>Domaine de Belle Vue 'Maceration' Pinot Gris' 2020, Vin de France</b>	<b>£49</b>
This skin contact wine is somewhere between pink and orange in colour – beautifully fresh and amazingly interesting	
<b>Radikon 'Slatnik' Bianco 2020, Friuli Venezia Giulia, Italy</b>	<b>£49</b>
Chardonnay, Tocai Friulano. Very approachable wine from this legendary estate – peach, apricot, nuts and herbs

Wonderfully rich and zesty with aromas of white flowers and a crisp, crunchy palate with flavours of fresh lemon	
<b>Raymond Morin 'SB21' Sauvignon Blanc 2021, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£30</b>
From 30 miles west of Sancerre – really pure Sauvignon at a fraction of the price of it's famous neighbour	
<b>Jean-Baptiste Adam Pinot Gris 'Reserve' 2020, Alsace</b>	<b>£32</b>
One of the oldest estates in Alsace – now the 14 <sup>th</sup> generation – textured wine with pears, peaches and gingerbread spice	
<b>Domaine 1006 Melon de Bourgogne 'Marine' 2020, Vin de France</b>	<b>£35</b>
The domaine is named after the length of the Loire River (1006 Km) - from a single plot of 40-year-old vines, this Melon oozes class – good weight from 6 months on the lees – apples, citrus and a spritz of sea-spray	
<b>Thierry Germain Saumur Blanc 'L'Insolite' 2020, Loire Valley</b>	<b>£39</b>
Intense Chenin Blanc from one of the very best – apple, lime, flint, spice and electric energy – sit back and enjoy!

Perfect balance of fruit, acidity and minerality from 40 year-old vines – citrus, gooseberry and blackcurrant leaf

This 100% Marsanne has benefited from a few years of bottle age – waxy, dried fruit, quince, spiced, baked apples

Marsanne/Roussanne. Ripe apricot, complex with a long, mineral finish here – great acidity for the appellation	
<b>Domaine Ventura Chablis 1er Cru 'Mont de Milieu' 2019, Burgundy</b>	<b>£53</b>
Wonderfully concentrated Chablis from this great vineyard – lemon, lime and slate-like minerality - brilliant	
<b>Domaine Josmeyer Riesling Le Dragon 2018, Alsace</b>	<b>£56</b>
High quality Riesling with plenty of body and texture – citrus, apples and minerals – bone dry, bloomin' marvellous	
<b>Yves Cuilleron Condrieu 'La Petite Côte' 2020, Northern Rhône</b>	<b>£59</b>
Viognier. Condrieu almost ceased to exist back in the 80s... winemakers like Cuilleron didn't let that happen!

Sometimes referred to as the 'Chablis of Italy' – crisp, citrusy and super-fresh... classics are classics for a reason!

Blend of 85% Fernao Pires/15% Arinto. Baked apples and spice with a touch of asparagus and a mineral, saline finish

Dry German Riesling bursting with flavours of citrus and apricots – steely, firm, tense and ever so elegant

Grown on loess soil in the highest altitudes of Wagram, vinified by brilliant Martin Diwald – citrus, peach, watercress

Caricante/Catarratto Bianco. Delicate, floral white wine vinified from fruit grown in volcanic soils at 500m altitude

A very non-German Riesling! A London twist has made her very green appely, limey, minerally and saline	
<b>Laventura Malvasia 2020, Rioja, Spain</b>	<b>£40</b>
Notes of apricot, quince, and lemon with a hint of honeysuckle – vibrant and slightly prickly texture	
<b>Forjas del Salnés Albariño 'Leirana' 2021, Rías Baixas, Spain</b>	<b>£42</b>
Lemon, mandarin, and grapefruit, plus a waft of sea breeze – the Rolls Royce of Albariño!

Very pure and precise Grüner, grown in vineyards at 700m altitude – peach and green apple with a wonderfully prickly texture and watercress finish – 50% of the wine was aged in old acacia barrels to add texture, not flavour

From one of the greatest Riesling vineyards in the world – peaches, lemons, and pineapple – off-dry, beautifully balanced
