SPARKLING WINE - TRADITIONAL

The fizz is created during a second fermentation, where sugar and yeast is added to an already fermented base wine to create the bubbles. In most cases, the second fermentation takes place in the final bottle, except for Prosecco, where the second fermentation takes place in a pressurised stainless steel tank, known as the Charmat method.

SPARKLING WINE – PÉT NAT

Petillant Naturel (naturally sparkling) wines are made with a single fermentation. The wines are bottled part-way through the fermentation, allowing the process to finish in the bottle, capturing the CO2 which creates the bubbles. These wines are usually (but not always) left un-fined and unfiltered under crown caps. Also, sometimes referred to as Méthode Ancestral.

ORANGE WINE

Orange wine is made with white wine grapes using red winemaking techniques. The inclusion of the white grape skins in the process provides colour, texture and additional flavour.

An intriguing blend of Falanghina and Trebbiano from the region to the north of more famous Puglia – another great intro to skin contact (orange) wine with plenty of complexity and texture... and colour!

Müller-Thurgau. Fermented with skins for 16 days – little colour, a delicate, floral number – great intro to Orange
- Màquina y Tabla 'El Oso y la Alemana' 2020, Toro, Spain** £32
Blend of Verdejo and Malvasia - the extended contact on skins gives the wine intense depth, quince and apricot skin, something just a touch savoury and then that ginger and spicy citrus push through on the long fresh finish
- Pol Opuesto 'El Otro Lado' Torrontes 2020, Uco Valley, Argentina** £34
An orange Torrontes! Apricot and quince stone fruits abound and plenty of aromatic florals - outstanding
- Quinta de Santa Teresa Avesso 'Curtimenta' 2022, Minho, Portugal** £35
100% Avesso. An amber and orange hue with aromas of mango, thyme and beeswax, with notes of dried apricots
- Arianna Occhipinti 'SP68' Bianco 2022, Sicily, Italy** £38
Incredible blend of Zibibbo and Albanello with a few days on the skins – fresh and fragrant – an incredible wine
- Qvevri Wine Cellar Rkatsiteli 'Qvevri' 2019, Kakheti, Georgia,** £38
Made from the ancient Georgian vine variety Rkatsiteli. After fermentation, the wine is stored for 6-7 months in qvevri sealed with clay. Dried fruits, flowers and roasted walnuts, rasping tannins
- Renegade 'Maria' Madelaine Angevine 2022, Herefordshire, England** £38
Aromatic skin contact wine made from Mad Ange - a little like Bacchus but more savoury with basil and lemon notes
- Ancre Hill Orange Wine 2021, Monmouthshire, Wales** £39
Mainly Albariño - 100% whole bunch maceration for between 30 to 50 days - nectarine & tangerine herbal notes
- Oriol Artigas 'El Rumbera' 2019, Alella, Spain** £40
Xarel-lo (or Pansa Blanca as it is called in Alella) is more commonly associated with Cava – this still wine spends a short amount of time on the skins to produce a wonderfully textured wine with flavours of apple, nectarine and sea-spray
- COS Pithos Bianco 2021, Sicily, Italy** £40
Grecanico (AKA Garganega). Fermented for 7 months in amphorae - delicate with great complexity and a pithy finish
- La Del Terreno 'Ninja de las Uvas' 2021, Murcia, Spain** £42
100% Macabeu. 15 days maceration, spontaneous fermentation, aged for 12 months in 500l barrels – easy skinsy!
- Channing Daughters Pinot Grigio Ramato 2019, Long Island, New York State, USA** £42
Ramato is Italian for copper and the colour says it all! Apricot, peach and a wonderfully bitter afternote
- Testalonga Chenin Blanc 'El Bandito Skin' 2021, Swartland, South Africa** £45
One of the cult skin-contact wines – 2021 only spent 14 days with the skins and is fresh and very appley
- Joseph Swan 'Catie's Corner' Grenache 2017, Russian River Valley, California, USA** £48
Copper coloured with flavours and textures of apple skin, hints of white flowers and orange peel
- Radikon 'Slatnik' Bianco 2020, Friuli Venezia Giulia, Italy** £49
Chardonnay, Tocai Friulano. Very approachable wine from this legendary estate – peach, apricot, nuts, and herbs
- Jolie Laide Pinot Gris 2021, Sonoma County, California, USA** £52
Brand new vintage of this super-stunning wine! More pink than orange due to the skin colour of Pinot Gris – electrifying acidity from super winemaker Scott Schultz
